Storage for one Trishaw

Special thanks to the Board of the Leander Boat Club for generously offering free space for us to store one trishaw for the summer season.

The Boat Club is on the waterfront path which is an excellent location for us. Volunteers will be given the door code and able to access the trishaw. The storage room location has a nearby power outlet and instructions regarding locking and charging the batteries will be posted.

Agency Update

We are working with several seniors' homes to finalize partnership agreements and a ride

schedule. On Tuesdays will be at the Welcome Inn. On Wednesdays we serve Good Shepherd clients who will come to William's on their bus. Shalom Village clients will ride on Thursdays. St Peter's Residence and Idlewyld Manor on the West Mountain are set for Friday morning and afternoons respectively. We are still working City Housing Hamilton to finalize their arrangements.

Things are moving along with two Burlington Chartwell Homes, however neither have space to store the trishaw. Recent meetings with the supervisor of Recreation (Mandy Kerr) and City Councillor (Lisa Kearns) have resulted in the offer of storage at Aldershot Arena which we are still reviewing given its distance from downtown.

For both Hamilton and Burlington, we are still working to plan 'community /open rides' where seniors not affiliated with centres can sign up for a ride. These will likely be Mondays, weekends or perhaps evenings.
