Our 3rd trishaw....the VeloPlus

We recently received a notice that we had been awarded a New Horizons for Seniors' Federal Grant which, along with the funds raised at Tracie's Place at the 50/50 Karaoke Draws, and some excellent fundraising by family members and staff at Idlewyld Manor, has enabled us to purchase another trishaw. The VeloPlus model (pictured above) allows wheelchair passengers to simply roll onto the ramp, get strapped in and ride in their own wheelchairs. We are expecting delivery in late April and a celebration is planned for the morning of Saturday, May 6. We will unveil and name the new trishaw up at Idlewyld Manor, (449 Sanitorium Road). We are working with Idlewyld and St. Peter's Residence at Chedoke to arrange on site storage. We have also applied for an additional grant so we can transport this trishaw down to some of the other centres throughout the summer.

Burlington Locations – likely four new ones

Val C and I (Nancy) met with residents and staff at 4I0 John Street in Burlington and showed them pictures and videos of passengers riding around the waterfront. The residents were keen and we are now working with staff to complete the partnership agreement so that regular weekly rides from this 143 unit seniors' building can start in June.

We think we will now have every weekday filled in Burlington with 5 centres all within 3km of the Trishaw Storage Shed at 2285 New Street.

The estimate of 72 pilots assumes 5 weekly rides at 2 locations and that each pilot takes on a ½ day a week. Last year, with five regular weekly sites and 30 pilots, we had a healthy balance. With lots of summer vacations we found that on occasion we were low on enough pilots. We'll try again to find the right balance this summer.
